Rev. H. Padgett Robinson is a native of South Carolina. He grew up in Clarendon County and finished high school at Olanta. He is an alumnus of Newberry College, Coker College, and the University of North Carolina. He received his specialized training for the ministry at Holmes Theological Seminary.

The author has been a minister of the South Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church since 1934. He has served a number of pastorates, including East Rockingham P. H. Church, the longest tenure in the largest church of the Conference. During the ten years of this pastorate a spacious and commodious auditorium was erected, a radio ministry was begun that reached out with telling effect, and the Sunday School attendance climbed to a record-breaking high of over eleven hundred. While in this pastorate Brother Robinson also served as Assistant Superintendent of his Conference.

My church has honored me often with important assignments and responsible appointments, but on no occasion do I feel that a higher tribute has been given to me than having been selected as speaker for the second series of the King Memorial Lectures. This annual event is to become a perpetual Memorial to the late Bishop Joseph Hillery King.

In meditating upon the great mental and spiritual stature of this resourceful man, his broad and profound theological concepts, his scholastic and cultural attainments, his penetrating insight into the mysteries of infinity, I find myself quailing before this gigantic task and frightened with the consciousness of the paucity of my own resources.

It was my privilege to hear this giant of the pulpit speak only a few times in the latter years of his life. Yet, each time I heard him preach, he made such a profound impression upon my life until a quarter of a century has not been able to erase the imprint of those challenging moments and spiritual transformations.
