

Timeline of Life Events
Rev. H. Padgett Robinson

(Information from Biography by Agnes Robinson unless otherwise noted)

- 1914, July 17 – Born Hugh Padgett Robinson to Redding and Mary Sue Coker Robinson in Clarendon County, South Carolina.
- 1931 – Saved at age 17 near Barineau Crossroads in Clarendon County, SC, and called to preach
- 1934 – Joined the SC Conference of the PH Church (formerly a member of the Original Free Will Baptist Church)
- 1934, October 8 – Received his local preacher’s license at age 20 from the SC Conference (date on certificate).
- 1936, October 5 – Ordained at age 22 by Bishop J.H. King in Lake City, SC (date on certificate).
- 1938 – Enrolled at Holmes Theological Seminary, Greenville, SC. (1938-1941)
- 1938 to 1941 – First pastorate in Upper SC Conference while attending Holmes (probable dates).
- 1941, June – Graduated from Holmes.
- 1941, July – Second pastorate near Lake City, SC. (according to the article in the memorial edition of Advocate by E.W. Ingram; probable date)
- 1942, July – Third pastorate at Darlington PH Church, Darlington, SC (according to the same article referenced above; probable date).
- 1942, July – Elected president at age 28 of the Pentecostal Holiness Youth Society for the SC Conference (probable date based on his re-election in July 1946).
- 1942 to 1945 – Attended Coker College (probable graduation date is the spring of 1945).
- 1944, July – Elected Assistant Superintendent of the SC Conference at age 30.
- 1945, November – Appointed founding editor of *The Builder*, the monthly newspaper of the SC (*The Builder*, Vol. 1, No. 1) at age 31.
- 1946 – Re-elected president of the PHYS for the SC Conference. Left Darlington P.H. Church to be full-time youth and evangelism director. (*The Builder*, Vol 1, No. 10).
- 1947, May – Reported to the Conference the results of the first six months of full-time evangelism and youth work as president of the PHYS (*The Builder*, Vol 2, No 4).
- 1947, May 15 – Married Agnes Catherine Bradley, daughter of missionaries Amos and Effie Bradley, in Atlanta, GA.

- 1947, July – Fourth pastorate at age 33 of East Rockingham PH Church, East Rockingham, NC where He served as pastor for 10 years. During this period, he attended a UNC campus in the area and earned some graduate-level credits. (He also attended Newberry College at some point in his career, but the exact dates cannot be determined at this time.)
- 1957, July – Elected Superintendent of the SC Conference at age 43.
- 1960, July 4-16 – Ebenezer Camp Meeting speaker (Sermon Titles & Travels 1960).
- 1960, July 20-31 – Oklahoma Camp Meeting speaker (Sermon Titles & Travels 1960).
- 1960, Aug 2-11 – Wichita, Kansas Camp Meeting speaker (Sermon Titles & Travels 1960).
- 1960, Aug – Bethel Free Will Baptist Camp Meeting speaker (Sermon Titles & Travels 1960).
- 1960, Oct – Elected as a denominational representative on the Board of Governors of the SC Christian Action Council (The Challenge newsletter, December 1960).
- 1961, Feb – Bible and Fellowship Conference speaker for the Maryland and Eastern Virginia Conferences (VA & MD Conference 1961).
- 1961, June – Holmes Camp Meeting speaker (Holmes Camp Meeting 1961).
- 1961, August – Elected Assistant General Superintendent of the PH Church, Richmond, VA and assigned the chairmanship of the Board of Publications for the denomination.
- 1961, October – Delivered the King Memorial Lectures at Emmanuel College (College records).
- 1964 – Built a new air-conditioned auditorium to replace the old open-air tabernacle (*The Challenge* newsletter, 1964, Vol. 1, Spring Quarter).
- 1964, June – Was the graduation speaker at Emmanuel College (*The Advocate*, 1964, July 11).
- 1965 – Published first book, *Redemption Conceived and Revealed*, the manuscript of the 1961 King Memorial Lectures (Published by Advocate Press, 1965).
- 1965, May – Spoke at the Joint Christian Workers Institute and Prayer Conference in Falcon, NC (Christian Workers' Institute).
- 1965, December 30 – Died at Lake Mattamuskeet, NC. He was 53.
- 1966, January 2 – Funeral services were held in the SC Conference tabernacle with Bishop J.A. Synan officiating. (Memorial issue of *The Advocate*, Feb 5, 1966).
- 1966 – New auditorium of the SC Conference named the H.P. Robinson Memorial Auditorium.
- 1969 – Book of Sermons Published, *Heaven's Quest for a Man like God*, edited by Agnes Robinson (Published by Advocate Press, 1969).
