## I. Constant Viligence. "Watch Ye."

- a. Telescope view. Looking at things from a long distance.
  Ascertain things as far in advance as possible. Eagle eye.
- b. Misroscopic view. Looking at things closely. Ascertain the features that are hidden to ordinary means of seeing. The microscope reveals things that will never appear to causual looker.
- c. Circumspective view. Attentive to all circumstances or consequences; cautions; prudent. Webster Dict. The group of synonyms is completed by Naphein, which signifies a state untouched by an slumberous an beclouding influence and thence, one that is guarded against advance of drowsiness or bewilderment. Theyer Greek Lexicon.

## II. Constant Prayerfullness. "Pray Always."

- a. There should be fixed periods for prayer. Daniel prayed three times a day. The apostles went up to the temple at the hour or prayer.
- b. Prayer may be in the form of a personal petition; intercessory in the behalf of others; or if may be agonizing as in the case of Christ in the garden.
- c. Praying always is a state or an attitude of prayerfulness even though we may not be on our knees.
- III. Constant Activity. "Blessed Is That Servant Whom His Lord Finds So Doing."
  - a. Doing active labor. God worked. Jesus said, "My Father works and I work."
  - b. Specific work. "So doing," It is not enough to work, must find our specific work.
  - c. Faithfulness in work. Others might go and come, but the servant remained until his Lord returned. "Occupied til I come."
